# A Leading Nurse

**L**t. Col. Jeffrey Ashley has become what he is by accident, a car accident, that is.

Just when he began to believe his dream of helping people through a career in medicine was beyond his grasp, his mother was in a car accident and needed extended care at home.

Suddenly Ashley found his perfect career: nursing. He discovered he was adept at caring for his mother.

Ashley, a 1985 graduate of PLNU, is now working on his Ph.D. in nursing at the University of California, San Francisco.

"As I look back on that experience, I see the exact fit for me in nursing, but at the time, I didn't know how 'right on target' I was."

But he had hit the bull's eye. A few years later he would graduate with his nursing class, before going on to spend 20 years caring for Army personnel and their families; earn his master of science degree and begin a Ph.D.; and travel to third-world countries to offer medical aid.

"Jeff is a natural leader, and one in whom people feel comfortable placing their trust. He is passionate about nursing and about excellence in patient care," said Dottie Crummy, dean of the School of Nursing. "Yet he isn't preachy about it, but rather, I think, leads by example."

Ashley has helped both the young and the old come to grips with illness, and sometimes death. He has been able to give back to retired military who gave so much for the entire country. He has seen HIV/AIDS move from a terminal illness to a chronic disease, and he has come to outrank most of the doctors with whom he works.

And all the while, one thing has remained: his missionary zeal for nursing. "I think of nursing as a very spiritual profession. It's not just caring for a person with a diagnosis, it's everything that comes with it, from dealing with the family to helping the patient navigate his or her situation to the next stage in the process." Ashley said.

"I believe that nursing is about helping people be complete, and being complete isn't necessarily limited to a dichotomy of living or dying, but about the quality of the journey between life and death."

He credits much of his philosophy to his time at Point Loma, where he learned the importance of spirituality in health care and how the state of one's soul could affect recovery or acceptance of illness.

From every student and every professor and staff member at Point Loma, Ashley said he learned to view life and the influence of God on life as inseparable. "Such an outlook prepares one to look at life from a standpoint of individual responsibility for one's actions and experience, while availing oneself of the strength, power and peace of God." ■

## Alumni Excel

### ALUMNI WHO EXCELLED IN PREMIER LAW SCHOOL SAY PLNU FACULTY ENCOURAGEMENT MADE A DIFFERENCE

It's not every day that two PLNU alumni, a speech communication major and a physics major, both graduate from one of the nation's most highly esteemed law schools. But at least one PLNU professor isn't surprised.

A significant influence on **Sarah Kleven** (99) and **Jordan Cunningham** (00) to earn law degrees from the University of California, Berkeley's Boalt Hall School of Law was the personal and unique impact of key PLNU faculty.

"Jordan and Sarah excelled as students here, and they excelled at one of the most premier law schools in the country, in an academic environment that prides itself with having the crème de la crème of students around the nation," said Mike McKinney, who co-directs PLNU's pre-law program.

Currently working in Washington, D.C., for the law firm Sutherland, Asbill and Brennan, Kleven knew she wanted to be an attorney from an early age. McKinney's encouragement motivated her to reach for a top law school.

"Dr. McKinney gave me the extra confidence. He made it clear that he thought I could compete with any students at any top law school," said Kleven, a speech communication major originally from Lancaster, Calif.

Kleven graduated from Boalt Hall in 2003 and then spent a year clerking for a justice on the Alaska State Supreme Court. Kleven's current area of practice is civil litigation, from employment suits to security and trade cases. She ultimately wants to pursue criminal law and work as a public defender. It was listening to McKinney talk about civil rights and the imperative of a balanced justice system that first enticed Kleven to consider being a public defender.

"The poor and the marginalized have access to the courts, but barely," said McKinney. "The greatness of our country really depends on equal access and strong representation."

Kleven said she understands that some people look critically at public defenders, but contends, "As Christians, we should want to advocate for people who are less privileged. Without balanced advocates on both sides, there is no real justice."

"PLNU taught me the importance of character in all areas—from what I represent in a case to how I interact with a client or opposing counsel," said Kleven. "The fact that those things are valued at PLNU helped train me to be a person of integrity."

Physics major Jordan Cunningham's experience at PLNU prepared him for Boalt Hall School of Law and his position at Jones Day, the third largest firm in the nation.

Cunningham, whose hometown is Atascadero, Calif, said it is difficult to name the faculty most key to his growth, because "so many professors influenced me." But when pressed, he chose McKinney ("...by being generally impressive and having such an amazing diversity of intellectual interests."); Maggie Bailey ("She encouraged me to work in politics before law school."); and Keith Walker ("Keith was my mentor throughout my time in the physics department; he also encouraged my atypical career path, and, more than any single human ever, forced me to think and work harder.")

Cunningham interned in an FBI gun lab before his senior year. Later he pursued politics and government, interning for the mayor of San Diego and then entering a fellowship program with the California State Senate. A 2004 graduate of Boalt Hall, Cunningham currently practices civil litigation, focusing on employment discrimination defense and commercial disputes.

"Every case has different facts and different rules of law to apply. To have wide-ranging interests really fits in very nicely with litigation," said Cunningham. The liberal arts focus at PLNU "left me well suited to law. Expanding my intellectual curiosity is the biggest thing PLNU did for me," said Cunningham.

"These kids competed with the very best, and they simply dazzled," said McKinney. ■

## Time to Capture This Tuition Offer

**W**ouldn't you like to go out to dinner tonight, order a meal, and then pay the price of that meal from 10 years ago? Wouldn't it be fabulous to purchase a house and pay the asking price from 12 years before?

I haven't found the restaurant or neighborhood that provides this yet, but it is possible to purchase future tuition at today's price and have it credited for a child who is only 5 or 6 years old. A national program called "The Independent 529 Plan" allows you to purchase a percentage of tuition based on today's rates and receive that same percentage when your child or grandchild enrolls in college—no matter what the costs for that university or college may be at the time.

The Independent 529 Plan includes more than 240 private colleges and universities across the nation including Point Loma Nazarene University, Seattle Pacific University, Wheaton College, Stanford University, and Carnegie Mellon University. When tuition is purchased, the certificate is in the name of the child and may be applied to any of the participating institutions. The child must still apply through the admissions process and be accepted by the university before enrolling.

This plan can offer real savings whether you start small or big, early or late. Of course, if started while the child is young, locking in these tuition costs may provide very significant savings when the child enrolls in college.

This plan has no entry fees, no annual fees and no exit fees. Your entire contribution is applied directly to tuition. You can contribute as little as \$25 a month, as long as a minimum of \$500 is accumulated within two years.

Every alum to whom I've mentioned this plan has reacted in a similar way: "Really, where can I find more information on this?" Since tuition costs across the country have more than tripled in the past 20 years, this is a good plan to consider.
