## SELECTING TRANSFERABLE GE COURSES

General Education courses at PLNU tend to focus on the broad, survey aspect of a subject area. Although it is possible for a course to be too broad, more often the courses in question are much too narrow in scope. It is essential to match the transfer course descriptions with PLNU course descriptions. Please consult the [PLNU catalog](#) to review the GE course titles and descriptions before selecting a transfer course. Then search your institution's website or catalog to find comparable course descriptions. Please keep in mind that some majors may require you to choose a specific GE course from our list. Be sure to look up your intended major in the [PLNU catalog](#) to determine which GE courses may be required for your major as well. \*Prospective students are not required to complete all GE courses before transferring to PLNU – please consult your PLNU Admissions Counselor for specific transfer policies.\*

There are four main areas in PLNU's General Education program and twelve categories. Below each category, we have listed key concepts, terms, and common wording to help prospective students select the most appropriate transferable courses.

---

### I. Responding to the Sacred

#### A. BIBLICAL FOUNDATIONS [2 COURSES; 5 UNITS]

#### **BIB/THE/CHU –**

It is recommended that transfer students take their GE religion courses at PLNU. Students transferring to the University for the first time with 48 or more units, none of which are in religion, take only five units in this category (three of which must be chosen from the upper-division Christian Tradition section).

## II. Developing Cognitive Abilities

### A. PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT [1 COURSE; 3-4 UNITS]

<i>Required of transfer students with a minimum of 24 units.</i>		

#### PSY –

Look for “Intro” or “General” psychology. Most colleges offer a basic psychology survey course.

### B. CRITICAL THINKING AND COMMUNICATION [2 COURSES; 8 UNITS]

*All students must fulfill the composition requirement prior to the junior year.*

#### WRI – (or listed as ENGL)

Look for “Freshman or College Composition”. This 5 unit PLNU course is often split into two 3 unit courses. Although it is listed as “WRI” at PLNU, other colleges may list it under the “ENGL” section of their catalog. At least one of the courses needs to include a “research” paper. Key words are “writing process”, “essay”, “expository”, “college writing”. Courses that will NOT transfer include the words pre-college, basic sentence structure, remedial, or reading.

#### COM – (or listed as SPE)

Look for a survey communication course with “public speaking” and “oral speech methods” included. Argumentation and debate courses are also applicable as long as public speaking is required. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE are small group or interpersonal communication.

---

**C. PROBLEM SOLVING [1 COURSE; 3-4 UNITS]**

**MTH –**

Look for “Calculus I” or “Calculus with Analytic Geometry” with a minimum of “4 units”. There is no equivalent to MTH303 at other institutions. If your major doesn’t specifically require calculus, you have the option to wait until your junior year to take Problem Solving at PLNU to complete the GE math requirement. For first-time transfer students, a 3 unit Calculus course may be transferred to fulfill the GE Math requirement, but this exception does not apply if Calculus is required for your major.

**III. Exploring an Interdependent World**

**A. THE NATURAL WORLD [2 COURSES; ONE FROM EACH GROUP, AND AT LEAST ONE WITH A LAB; 8-9 UNITS]**

***Biological Science [1 course from this group]***

**BIO** – (or listed as ZOO)

Look for “general”, “human”, “environmental”, or animal biology. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE are too specific like oceanography or marine biology. First-time transfer students have the option of completing 7 units of science total. At least one of the two science courses needs a lab. This exception does not apply to students who have attended in the past or who are currently attending PLNU. These students need at least 8 units of science to complete the GE requirement.

**CHE/PHY/PSC** – (or listed as PHYS, EARTH)

Look for “intro”, “general”, or “fundamental” chemistry. Physical science or general physics transfer easily. Some “earth sciences” will transfer as well if they are purely physical science and not biology. Courses that will NOT transfer are physical geography, meteorology, or oceanography. First-time transfer students have the option of completing 7 units of science total. One of the two science courses needs to include a lab. All other PLNU students need 8 units of science.

**B. PHYSICAL FITNESS AND NUTRITION [2 COURSES; 2-4 UNITS]**

*Any activity course numbered Physical Education 102-184 and one of the following:*

**PED Activity** – (or listed as PHYE, EXSC, KIN)

Look for a fitness “activity” that is at least “one unit”, such as “golf”, “aerobics”, or “varsity soccer”. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE are gym attendance. The PE requirement may be waived with a valid military ID/transfer of two semesters of ROTC coursework/DD214.

**PED** – (or listed as PHYE, EXSC, KIN)

Look for a course that combines a wellness lecture and physical activity with a physical fitness assessment before and after the course. This can be hard to find at another institution, so we recommend taking PED100 at PLNU. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE are nutrition and human sexuality. The PE requirement may be waived with a valid military ID/transfer of two semesters of ROTC coursework/DD214.

**C. THE SOCIAL WORLD [1 COURSE; 3-4 UNITS]**

**ECO –**

Look for either “macroeconomics” or “microeconomics”; combined courses are too broad.

**POL -**

Look for “intro” to political science; American government will NOT transfer for GE.

**SOC – (or listed as ANTH)**

Look for “intro” to sociology, “cultural anthropology”, or “social problems”. Sociology of the family will NOT transfer for GE.

**IV. Seeking Cultural Perspectives**

**A. THE HISTORY OF WORLD CIVILIZATIONS [2 COURSES; 6 UNITS]**

**HIS –**

Look for “world” history split into two time periods, the first half and second half. First-time transfer students may substitute U.S. or Western History I and II to complete this requirement. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE focus too narrowly on a specific culture or time period.

**B. THE FINE ARTS [2 COURSES FROM DISTINCT AREAS; 4-5 UNITS]**

**ART –**

Look for “intro”, “survey”, “orientation”, or “appreciation” art that includes “history” and/or “visual art”. It must be general enough to cover all aspects of art. Examples of courses that will NOT transfer for GE are drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, or 3-D design.

**MUH –**

Look for “intro” or “appreciation” to music that includes “listening” and “history” concepts. It must be general enough to cover all genres of music. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE are music theory/fundamentals, jazz, voice, or piano.

**TRE – (or listed as DRAM)**

Look for “intro” to theatre that includes “history” and “appreciation” of the theatre arts. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE are acting, literature, and film.

**C. PHILOSOPHY [1 COURSE; 3 UNITS]**

**PHL –**

Look for “intro” to philosophy and “ethics” or “values” and “reality and knowledge”. Courses that will not transfer for GE are logic and critical thinking.

**D. LITERATURE [2 COURSES; 5-6 UNITS]**

*Two courses, at least one from Masterpieces.*

**LIT – (or listed as ENGL)**

Look for at least one “masterpiece” that includes “world” literature broken down into at least 2 “time periods”. The other course can be a “great works” course of a specific “genre” like “short story”, “novel”, “poetry”, or “drama”. Courses that will NOT transfer for GE are too specific like Shakespeare or too focused on creative writing, not literature.

**E. FOREIGN LANGUAGE\* [2 COURSES; 8-9 UNITS]**

*One of the following sequences in the same language, all or part of which may be waived by examination or by petition when English is not the student's native language:*

**SPA/GER/FRE/BLA –**

Most colleges don't cover as much content in foreign language as PLNU. Generally, 3 semesters of a foreign language are required to equal two semesters at PLNU. ASL (American Sign Language) does NOT transfer to PLNU.
