Through the fellowships, the selected journalists gain a valuable understanding and historical context of the Kyoto Prize Laureates' works and their impact on our world.

Fall Journalism Fellowship

The fall journalism fellow will travel to Kyoto, Japan to attend the Kyoto Prize Ceremony honoring the current year's Laureates. In Kyoto, the fellow will participate in unique learning opportunities within the specific fields of each Laureate and receive special access to the Laureates during exclusive interviews, lectures and workshops.

- *The deadline to apply is September 1, 2011*
- *The fellowship recipient will be announced September 15, 2011*

Spring Journalism Fellowship

The spring journalism fellow will travel to San Diego for the Kyoto Prize Symposium to participate in dynamic learning experiences with each Laureate at small VIP receptions, lectures, presentations, and workshops. The fellow will also be provided with special access to the Laureates and an opportunity to interact with PLNU's top journalism students.

- *The Kyoto Prize Symposium will be March 20-22, 2012*
- *Applications will be available on January 9, 2012*
- *The deadline to apply is February 16, 2012*
- *The fellowship recipient will be announced February 21, 2012*

Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee comprised of faculty from the PLNU Department of Journalism as well as a representative from a San Diego media outlet.
