

POINT LOMA NAZARENE UNIVERSITY - CURRICULUM CHECKLIST (begin class of 2017)

This checklist is only a guide to courses. A schedule of classes is published annually. Careful planning is essential. 128 units required for PLNU graduation. Last 24 units must be in residence. A grade of at least "C" (2.000) must be earned in all courses required for the major in Nursing (prerequisite and co-requisite courses included) in order to progress to the next course or level. For non-NSG courses, a "C" is defined per course syllabus. FYE100 and NSG150 must be completed with a minimum grade of "B".

- *** Responding to the Sacred: Transfer students with ≥ 48 units need take only 2 courses at PLNU (one course must be upper division = CHU 395 or THE 306)
- + Child Development may be accepted in lieu of Human Development, but student will be required to take 2 units in Adult Development during the nursing program.
- ++ Required for all Freshman students and transfer students with < 24 units. All others should take PSY 103.
- +++ A total of 5 units in Literature/Philosophy must be taken including a minimum of one literature class.
- # Prerequisite for nursing courses
 - BIO 220 – NSG 260 (Adult Health II) – BIO 220 must be taken Spring Pre-nursing semester or Fall Sophomore semester
 - WRI 110 or WRI 120 or WRI 115/116 – NSG 399 (Nursing Research)
 - MTH 203 – NSG 399 (Nursing Research)
 - PSY 321 – NSG 450 (Community Mental Health)
 - SOC 360–NSG 460 (Community Health)
 - All other GE courses have some scheduling flexibility but must be taken **sometime** before graduation
